

Programs

Food and Medicine Program

Our food and medicine program focuses on fighting against hunger and malnutrition and providing relief to medical shortages especially amongst children.

This program delivered more than 4.3 Tons of Medicines and Food to 4 organizations in Caracas, Zulia and Vargas Venezuela, serving +300 people.

Sponsorship Program

This year we launched our sponsorship program thanks to our partnership with Feeding Smiles. The program focuses on supporting low-income people suffering from life-threatening diseases by covering their medical expenses and providing food.

Through this program we sponsored 5 children/young adults fighting different types of diseases in Caracas.

3 of these children are still in stable conditions thanks to our support and that of their families.

Unfortunately, one of them passed away. His name was Brandon Proyotto and he was 23 years-old and was suffering from leukemia. Thanks to our support Brandon was recovering during 2019 until December when he had a medical decline and his situation turned to the worst. He was sponsored to fly to Rome to undergo a bone marrow transplant but the treatment did not work. He passed away on December 15th in Italy.

Another case was Mariangel. She was suffering from Osteopetrosis - a generalized infection in her bones. After a recent surgery she had from an accident, she passed away at the age of 13. Mariangel was loved by her mother, who took care of her, taught her sewing and how to make bracelets who she sold to make money.

Journalist Program

Our Journalist Program is at the very core of our mission - changing Venezuela one meal, one patient, one story at a time. The goal of this program is to remind Venezuelans that the country is full of potential and of people willing to fight all odds to bring about a better future for their families and friends.

Thanks to our journalist in the ground, this year we published 9 stories and 3 exclusive videos through our social media channels and website.
